Literacy


We will be talking about the different characters and settings in the story.

We will listen carefully to the poems and talk about our knowledge of the lifecycle of a butterfly using our key vocabulary.


We will take turns in conversation, listening to other people's ideas.

Active learning

We will have lots of opportunities to pay attention to detail as we explore the caterpillars close up. We will have the challenge of finding out more about the butterfly life cycle through images, poetry and drama..

We will choose the area of provision that interests us the most.

Critical thinking

We will have the opportunity to overcome problems we might face and begin to show resilience.

We will plan an design our own minibeasts giving us the opportunity to choose how to approach a task before we begin.



Things to remember

Things to do at home

When out walking, look for natural patterns in the environment.

Make a caterpillar using an egg box.

Collect 5 leaves— use these to help children understand more

E.g: Lay two leaves down. Ask your child to count them. Then ask, what will happen if we add 1 more. Lay the leaf down to check.

Repeat starting with different numbers.
